17TH INDIAN FILM FESTIVAL IN STUTTGART

From 15th until 19th July 2020, the 17th Indian Film Festival took place in Stuttgart. The event was organized by the Filmbüro Baden-Württemberg.



Due to the Corona pandemic, Europe's largest Indian film festival took place online. With the digital version of the film festival the organization team could reach a wider audience with its program.

The website of the Indian Film Festival was called more than 45.000 times. In addition, around 5.800 film screenings could be registered.

This year, the visitors of the Indian Film Festival could enjoy an extended program consisting of feature films, documentaries and short movies.

The supporting program of the Indian Film Festival took also place online this year. During a Tea Talk Friday's for Future activists from Mumbai and Delhi got the chance to speak about their projects. In the new talk series "Good Morning Mumbai" the festival attendees could gain an impression of the current situation in Mumbai and learn more about sustainable development in India.

The 18th edition of the Indian Film Festival shall take place from 21st until 25th July 2021. The organization team hopes that there will be real festival atmosphere in Stuttgart with Indian film guests and live performances once again in 2021. Perhaps some elements from the online film festival, which have proven themselves will be kept.



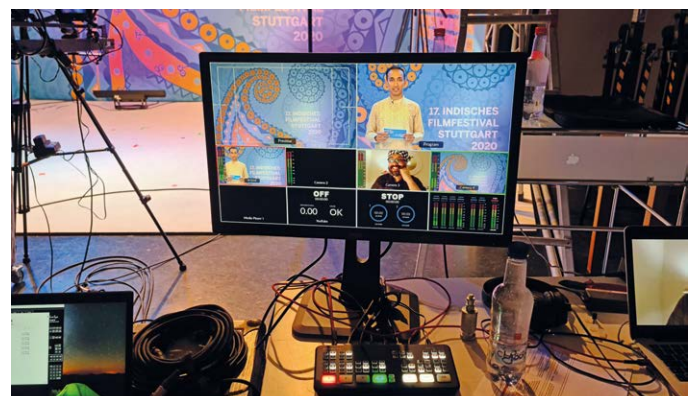

Since its premiere in 2017 the India Summer Days Karlsruhe present India in its cultural diversity. Every year, Karlsruhe celebrates the strong partnership between Germany and India as well as Baden-Wuerttemberg and Maharashtra.

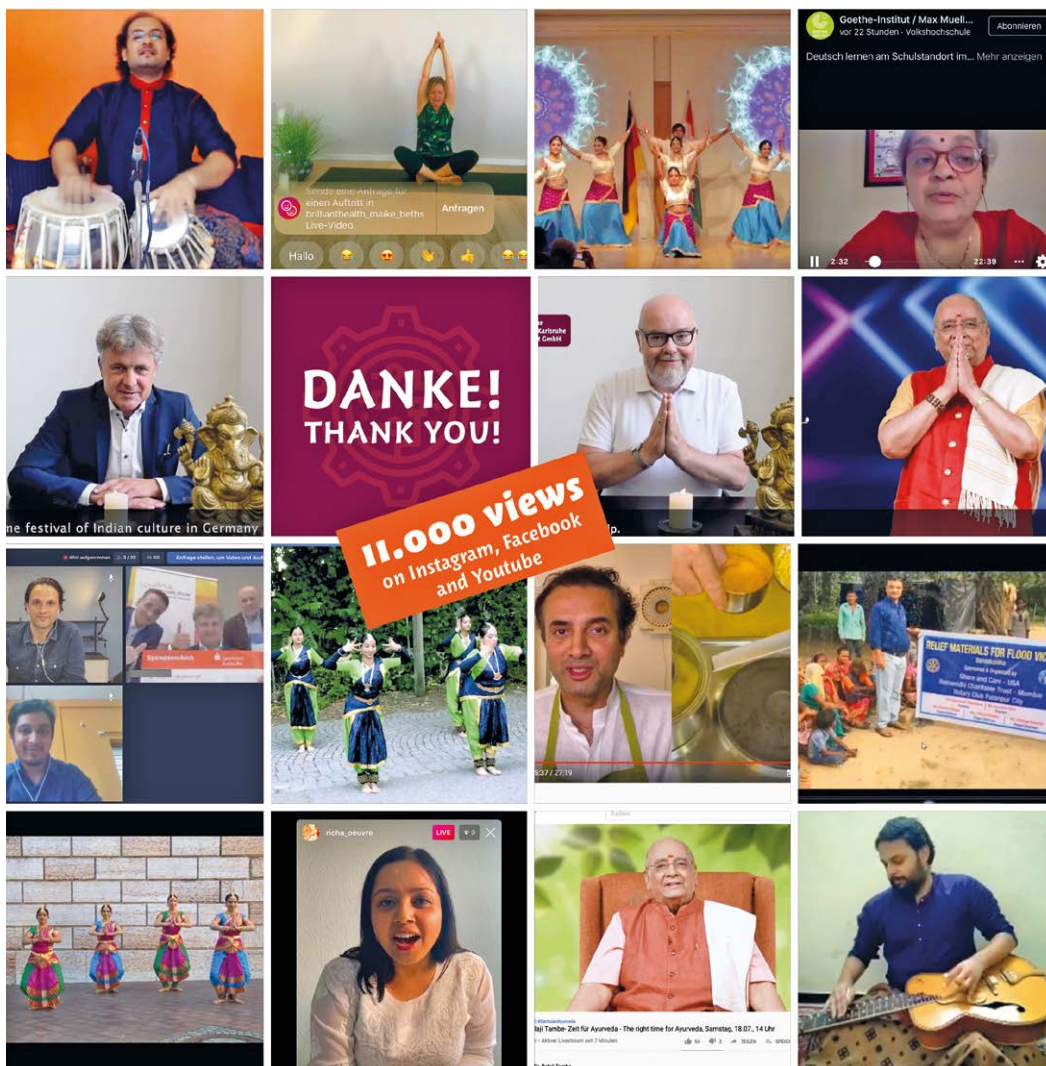
This year's India Summer Days took place virtually and inspired the audience in their homes.

From 17th up to 19th July 2020, the participants of the India Summer Days could attend lectures and workshops on yoga and Ayurveda and enjoy dance shows and art and cooking workshops.

In addition educational projects and social initiatives were presented during the online event. One of the highlights was a virtual tour of the cultural-historical Raja Dinkar Kelkar Museum in Pune. The audience was invited to watch, listen and actively participate.

Whether via Instagram, Facebook or YouTube - with around 11,000 hits, the participants of the India Summer Days showed their affinity for on-line formats and clicked enthusiastically through the program.

On Friday, 25th of September 2020 the first “Long Night of Consulates” took place in Stuttgart. The event was organized by the State Ministry Baden-Wuerttemberg and the Ministry of Justice and for Europe Baden-Wuerttemberg.

The “Long Night of Consulates” is part of the regional government’s stimulus programme for social cohesion.

On the 25th September 2020 nearly 30 consulates and cultural institutions opened their doors and informed about its work and projects. The Indian Honorary Consulate has also participated in the event and introduced itself to the citizens of Stuttgart. For this purpose the Consulate was represented with an information stall at Kleiner Kursaal Bad Cannstatt.

Among other things, the guests could ask questions about India, receive information materials and try Indian specialities. A highlight of the evening was a performance of an Indian dance group and a lecture from the book “So strange, so familiar: The Journey through India” by Klaus-Juergen Gadamer.

The “Long Night of the Consulates” was very well received by the visitors. Most likely there will be another “Long Night of Consulates” in 2021.

Propelled by the exchange coordinator Angelika Hoff, Teacher Trainer of English as a Foreign Language at Teacher Training College Stuttgart, Germany, students of TDI International School, Sonipat, Haryana, have received the opportunity of being taught the German language by young and motivated native German trainee teachers through online video conferences.

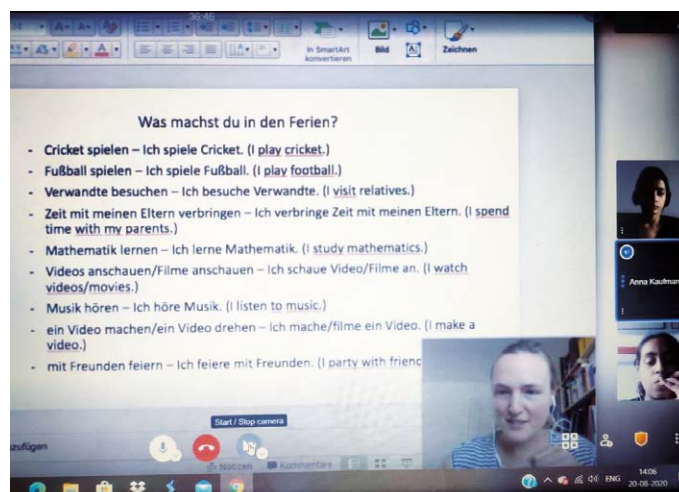
In summer 2020, Angelika Hoff and about 20 trainee teachers have conducted online live and interactive German classes with the students of TDI International School and thus promoted acceptance and understanding of an array of different cultural perspectives by offering excellent insights into Germany and its culture.

Moreover, in the academic year 2020/2021 a virtual teacher exchange, in which 11 teacher trainees from Teacher Training College Stuttgart will be paired up with 11 teachers from TDI International School and virtually invite each other to their lessons, will take place.

By organizing Indian exchange programmes Teacher Training College Stuttgart has played a key role in motivating young teachers to start their own Indian exchange once they have completed their training, thus promoting Indo-German friendship all over the state of Baden-Wuerttemberg through many newly established student exchange programmes in Germany's Southwest.

A comprehensive programme of music and dance performances awaited the guests.



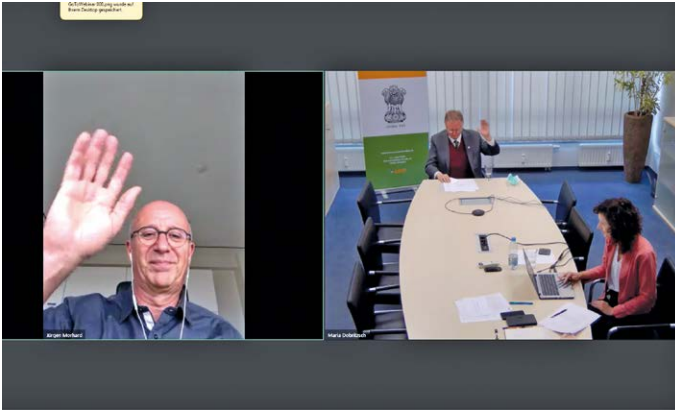

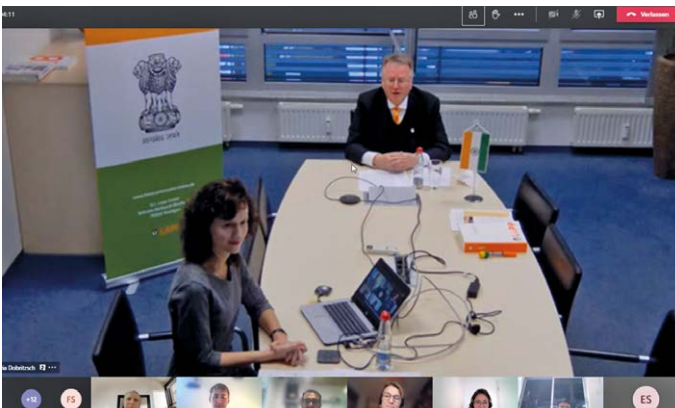
INDIAN DELEGATION VISITS LAPP VIRTUALLY

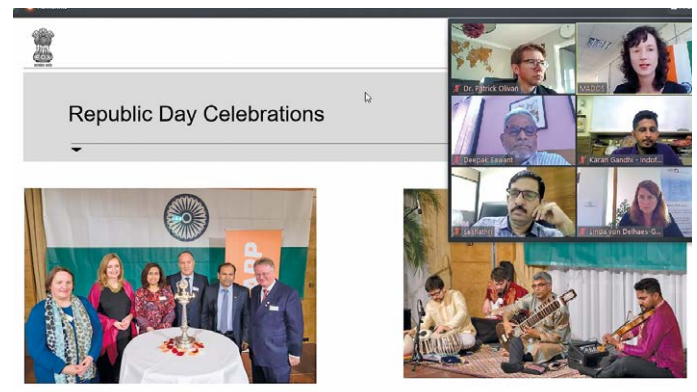
Honorary Consul Andreas Lapp welcomed the guests and gave a short presentation about LAPP and his tasks as Honorary Consul.
